BYLAW OF THE SUMMER VILLAGE OF WEST COVE, IN THE PROVINCE OF ALBERTA, TO AUTHORIZE THE SEVERAL RATES OF TAXATION IMPOSED FOR ALL PURPOSES FOR THE YEAR 2019.

WHEREAS the total requirements of the Summer Village of West Cove in the Province of Alberta as shown in the budget estimates are as follows:

WHEREAS, the estimated municipal expenditures and transfers set out in the budget for the Summer Village of West Cove for 2019 total \$548,627.06 and

WHEREAS, the estimated municipal revenues and transfers from all sources other than taxation is estimated at \$248,124.00 and \$72,226.33 from "Minimum Municipal Tax" and the balance of \$228,276.73 is to be raised by general municipal taxation; and

WHEREAS, the estimated amount to be collected for requisitions total \$141,753.34 (School \$130,185.96; Senior \$11,552.05; Designated Industrial \$15.33); and

WHEREAS, the amount of municipal taxation to be raise as a minimum amount payable of \$845.00 per each taxable property in the municipality is estimated to be \$72,226.33 and the remaining \$228,276.73 is to be collected based on municipal mill rates; and

WHEREAS the rates hereinafter set out are deemed necessary to provide the amounts required for municipal school and other purposes, after making due allowance for the amount of taxes which may reasonably be expected to remain unpaid;

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WHEREAS, the Council is authorized to classify assessed property, and to establish different rates of taxation in respect to each class of property, subject to the *Municipal Government Act* RSA 2000 Chapter M-26 Part 10 Division 2; and

1. The Municipal Administrator is hereby authorized and required to levy the following rates of taxation on the assessed value of all land, buildings and improvements as shown on the assessment and tax roll:
